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Why Have an Emergency Plan

Affected Parties

- Insurance
- Staff
- Residents
- Community
- Media







INSURANCE CONSIDERATIONS

- Some insurers will give a discount if there is an Emergency Plan in place.
- Plan creates a formal system for mitigating risk during emergencies.
- Reduces likelihood of a rejected claim due to failure

State of Emergency

- Your emergency plan is your bible
- Implement the part of the plan that is necessary (is this a building/project emergency or community-wide?)
- Communicate with your local agencies
- Make sure HA staff are responding where the plan has them responding







PARTNERS IN THE PLANNING PROCESS

- After 9-11 many communities set in place
 Emergency Plans
- Be a part of those annual discussions and plans
- Bring your Agency Plan and share, make any adjustments to fit some of your local plans, especially for State of Emergencies which are community-wide.

DISASTER PREPAREDNESS – DRILLS AND

PLAN AWARENESS

- Annually work with staff in reviewing Emergency Plans. Project-specific staff especially.
- Participate in any Fire Department Drills offered
- Community-wide drills
- Be aware that potential emergencies change with time, so review of plan is truly an annual Risk Management process.







Evacuation Drills







EVACUATION DRILLS

- Regularly schedule evacuation drills at multifamily sites
- Include local public safety in drills
- Practice real and varying scenarios
- Have staff observe and take notes
 - What went well
 - What did not
 - Who refused to participate







EVACUATION DRILLS

Recap

- Meet with Staff
- Meet with Public Safety Officials
- What improvements can be made?







EVACUATION DRILLS

Review and Update

- Annually
- After any drill
- After any actual disaster in your jurisdiction
- Any time new information is available that shows an update is needed.
